Boys & Girls Clubs serve 330,000+ youth statewide every year, partially through state-funded ASES and ELO-P programs. The California Alliance meets regularly with legislators and the Governor's office to share out-of-school program successes, build partnerships, and urge policymakers to continue to invest in youth and families.

ADMINISTERING A 3-YEAR PILOT CALVIP PROGRAM

In 2022, the California Alliance worked with 9 Los Angeles-area Boys & Girls Clubs to apply for state funding for a three-year violence prevention program. In 2024, the program continued with funding from the Board of State and Community Corrections, allowing the Clubs to provide intensive case management to members ages 10-18. RAND Corporation is evaluating the outcomes of the pilot project, and the CA Alliance plans to replicate the project and apply for additional funding for more Clubs throughout the state in the next round of grants.

YOUTH WORKFORCE READINESS



Boys & Girls Club of Kern County’s 2024 Summer Jobs Program Graduation. 36 teens were hired by the Clubs and placed with one of 17 local companies and non-profit organizations in various trades for June to July 2024.

This year **the California Alliance** awarded a total of \$1.4M+ to 90 Boys & Girls Clubs to support and build youth workforce readiness programs.

These programs are aimed at igniting youth ambition and introduce them to various industries to help youth gain employment experience and connections through apprenticeships, internships, and summer-job programs.
